- TUHSD students are in the final stages of registering for Dual Enrollment Courses through Estrella Mountain Community College. Campuses continue to see growth in the numbers of students selecting dual enrollment as an opportunity to earn college credit.
- University High School Class of 2017 showed an 87% ACT college readiness in English the national average is 54%
- Tolleson Union High School retained the River Rock trophy by beating their rivals, the Agua Fria Owls, in varsity football
