
Middle School Quiz Programs

Qwizdom is a student response system that instructors can use to create a rapid learning environment using interactive hardware, often known as remotes, clickers, and student response systems.

Kahoot! is a tool for using technology to administer quizzes, discussions or surveys. It is a game based

classroom response system played by the whole class in real time. Multiple-choice questions are projected on the screen. Students answer the questions with their smartphone, tablet or computer. Aside from being a great way to engage and focus a whole room of people, quizzes can be used to formatively assess the knowledge of each individual in the room, and adapt their learning accordingly. They can be used to track progress of individuals over time, and inspire learners to enquire further by creating their own quizzes.
