

Thoughts from Pastor Andy

One of my goals each year is to replace a bad habit with a good one. Is this the year that I finally stop those habitual sins for good

and live a holy life!? Most likely not. No matter how much inner strength I muster up, no matter how much I believe in myself, I will still sin. I can't help it. This year will most likely have just as much pain and hurt as the last, because it will always involve sin.

We will not always be strong enough to say "no" when we should, and we will not always be strong enough to say "yes" when we should. We can't train ourselves to fully eradicate sin from our minds and bodies. Sure we can tame the tongue and restrict our thoughts and actions, but we will never be able to stop ourselves from sinning.

St. Paul reminds us that nothing good dwells within our flesh and that we lack the ability to even do what is right before God (Rom. 7:18-19). There is no self-help book in the world that can improve this situation. But Paul doesn't leave us in despair! He also reminds us that we are not to depend upon our own strength, but that of Christ's!

"My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor. 12:9). These are the words spoken from Christ to you. It's at your weakest moment, when you are about to give it all up, when Jesus Christ takes over, and you see what true power and strength looks like.

You see, your weaknesses can be the greatest thing about you, because it is through them that you see Christ at work in your life! It is then that you fully learn to rely on God. It is then that you get to experience the glory of his strength. Now, don't hear what I'm not saying. I don't want you to glory in your weaknesses at all. But we can find peace in the midst of them, a peace of knowing that Christ's strength will show forth through them.

Personally, I'm glad I can't do all the things I set my mind to. I'm glad I don't have enough inner strength to make 2017 the best year of my life. If it were up to me and my own decisions, my life would be a mess. I rejoice, then, that it is God who sets my path and aligns my steps. It is God who brings me both successes and hurts. It is God who blesses me with another year to live in his presence.

I'm thankful for my weaknesses, because it shows my need for a savior; it points me to my Savior: Jesus Christ. My weaknesses show me God's mercy, grace, and love, because it is through Jesus' death and resurrection that I am made whole again. Where I fail, God reigns victorious! Where I am weak, there Christ is strong!

It is in Christ that your year now begins. It is in Christ that your year will go forth. So go forth and rejoice that it is in Christ's strength that you now live. It is Christ's strength that will guide you through this year and give you peace.

Christ Care ...


