



COVID-19 UPDATES

February 18, 2021

State/County Update:

Tulare County continues to be in the Purple tier but on a positive note, the number of cases per 100,000 has gone down substantially. The District is hopeful that the County will move into the red tier to allow In-Person instruction, at least under the hybrid model.

District Update:

Vaccinations:

The District partnered with Adventist Health to provide vaccinations to our staff that are 65 and over. This took place last weekend on Saturday, February 13, 2021.

The District has also partnered with Altura Health to schedule a vaccination clinic for our District staff. This will be held on Saturday, February 20, 2021, at one of their clinics. The District will continue to provide opportunities for our staff to get vaccinated. At this time, we have approximately 180 employees that have expressed interest in being vaccinated on Saturday. The District's goal is to have the majority of staff vaccinated.

- Credit recovery after school classes started this week. We are offering six (6) classes at Tulare Union and five (5) at Tulare Western and Mission Oak. We are offering English, Algebra 1, Geometry, World History, US History and Plato.
- Incoming Freshmen registration via Zoom started on Tuesday, February 9, 2021. We are in our second week of registration. The registration process is working well. We have received positive feedback from our school site teams and parents. <https://wke.lt/w/s/D0ngtb> Our completed registration numbers as of Tuesday, February 16, are as follows:
 - TU - 182 students (42%)
 - TW - 167 students (37%)
 - MO - 151 students (40%)
- We are continuing to work on a plan for the ELPAC and CAASPP test. At this time, these assessments are required and districts will be held to the 95% participation rate.
- New state guidance released in January, specifies that schools must complete and post to their website homepages a COVID-19 Safety Plan (CSP) prior to reopening for in-person instruction. The CSP consists of two parts: 1) the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP) and 2) the COVID-19 School Guidance Checklist. Even though this new guidance does allow grades K-6 to reopen in the purple tier if the case rate is below 25/100,000 (CR<25), the guidance for 7-12 grade has not changed. At this time, we are only allowed to implement our hybrid schedule once we are in the red tier for five (5) consecutive days.
