In 2016-2017, the percentage of students passing 5 out of 6 fitness standards on the California Physical Fitness Test will improve to a minimum of 70% in grades 5, 7, and 9. Formalized physical education is offered in grades 1-12. In addition, an enhanced nutrition services program was introduced in all schools in August 2014.

By the end of 2018, the goal is to improve the percentage of graduates completing the A-G sequence of courses to 65%. Additional A-G courses have been added including AP Capstone, AP Physics 1, AVID Senior Seminar, Chemistry Honors, Web Design, and Algebra II (Apex). This allows more course offerings to students that support their preparation for college. At Hillside High School, all courses offered are now A-G approved and follow the same curriculum as those offered at Upland High. This will support students who need an alternative setting to recover course credit to still be eligible for UC/CSU admission. We have also reconfigured the after school credit recovery program so that it matches the UHS/HHS curriculum and will be A-G compliant.
