Five Week Camping Program

Youth Corps Camping program combines education and job skill training with outdoor adventure. Crew members work on conservation, reforestation, and recreation projects, while developing leadership skills and learning how to work as a team. Crews camp in the field for their entire 5 week session. In addition to earning an educational stipend and high school credit, participants gain a sense of pride that comes with hard work, learn to become stewards of our public lands, and develop lasting friendships!

Backcountry Leadership Program

To participate in BLP you need a recommendation from a previous Youth Corps Camping Program.

The Backcountry Leadership Program (BLP) provides crew members with additional leadership skills and opportunities. As a part of the BLP team, you will hike deep into secluded wilderness areas and work on intense, challenging, and technical projects.

Five-Month AmeriCorps Program

Through the Idaho Service Corps (ISC), receive paid job-training experience as you meet the Idaho's highest priority conservation needs, including wildfire reduction, non-native weed eradication, and trail building and maintenance. In addition to accomplishing critical work, you'll earn professional certifications needed to become part of the next generation of stewardship leaders, as well as an AmeriCorps living allowance and education award.

Evenings are spent on related educational and recreational activities. Prepare to graduate with sore muscles, awesome technical skills, solid job reference, and an AmeriCorps living allowance and education award.

Once you have a login and password you can then login using those credentials and start the application.

Each position has different requirements that need to be filled out to complete the application. Basic information you will need to fill out the application is listed below.

Info needed for youth positions

- Past medical history information
- Three emergency contacts
- You will need a guardian signature if under age 18

Info needed for adult positions

- Current resume
- Three personal references
- Some positions also require a cover letter
