

When do I apply on USAJOBS?

NOW! Job announcements will be posted on USAJOBS between January 5 and January 30 and some announcements may only be open for 5 to 10 days.

Applications for FIRE jobs will be due early to mid-JANUARY!

Pay close attention to the closing date on the vacancy announcement and get your application submitted on time!

Additional NON-Fire job announcements may be posted in January and February. Most of our Summer Job hiring is completed by March!

What is the Pay?

These positions use the General Schedule Base Pay Scale. The pay scale is:

- GS-03 - \$12.19 per hour
- GS-04 - \$13.68 per hour
- GS-05 - \$15.31 per hour
- GS-06 - \$17.06 per hour

Step 9: Review and submit your application!

The Lincoln National Forest covers about 1.1 million acres in south-central New Mexico. The landscape varies from rugged canyons to gently sloping foothills. Elevations range from 4,200 feet above sea level to over 11,500 feet near Sierra Blanca.

The climate varies from warm and semiarid at lower elevations to cool and subhumid in the mountains. In the summer, temperatures can range from 60's to high 90's.
