As we prepare for a return to in-person instruction we want to remind everyone of our uniform colors. Technology Tip

Protecting The Chromebook Monitor

- When you shut your laptop, make sure there are no small items, such as a pencil or small ear-phones, on the keyboard. These can damage the display screen if the laptop is shut on them; the screen will scratch if the item is rough. Close the lid gently and holding it in the middle. Closing the lid using only one side causes pressure on that hinge, and over time can cause it to bend and snap.
- Hold and lift the computer by its base, not by its LCD display (the screen). If you lift it by the screen alone, you could damage the display or the hinges attaching the display to the base. The display is also easily scratched or damaged by direct pressure – avoid placing pressure on it.

Safety Tip

We are preparing for our return to in-person learning starting March 22nd, and an extensive mitigation plan has been put in place. All students and staff will continue wearing a face mask while onsite and will be washing hands frequently. One change to note is that with the possible number of students returning to campus increasing, we will not be able to guarantee six feet of physical distancing on the buses, in the classrooms, or in the common areas. We will continue to publish details of the safety measures in the weeks to come.
