All members participated telephonically.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

President Madruga led the pledge of allegiance.

3. Approval of the Regular Agenda

Mr. Chapman moved to approve the Regular Agenda; seconded by Mr. Villalon. In a roll call vote, the motion carried 5-0.

4. SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS

Superintendent Comments

- Celebration of Teacher Appreciation Week This week across our nation, we celebrate our teachers; those that have a profound impact on the lives of our students. Regardless of what subject matter you teach, understand how much I appreciate each and everyone of you, especially with the circumstances regarding this school year. 6. <u>DISCUSSION/ACTION OF ITEMS PREVIOUSLY PULLED FROM THE CONSENT AGENDA</u>

President Madruga moved to approve Consent Agenda items 1A, 2K, 2L, 2M, 2N, 2O, and 2Q previously removed from the Consent Agenda for discussion; seconded by Mr. Chapman.

Discussion:

Agenda Item 1A (Human Resources Personnel Items)

Dr. Flores asked about staffing for the 2020-2021 school year.

• Superintendent Gutierrez responded that we have less than five (5) teaching vacancies for the 2020-2021 school year at this time.

Dr. Flores asked for clarification regarding Agenda Items 2K, 2L, 2M, 2N, 2O, and 2Q.

Mr. Jeremy Calles, Chief Financial Officer, responded that he brought forward the summer projects for 2020 for approval/consideration tonight to ensure that they are completed in a timely manner.

Agenda Item 2K (Award use for Midstate Energy using the 1GPA 18-16PV-03 Job Order Contract for mechanical and electric replacement at La Joya Community High School, Sierra Linda High School, Tolleson Union High School and District Office)

• Mr. Calles shared that the mechanical and electric replacements are needed at these sites.

Agenda Item 2L (Award use for Rytan, LLC using the 1GPA 18-15PV-11 Job Order Contract for the 8 Classroom Additions and Gym Lobby Addition at La Joya Community High School)

 Mr. Calles shared that these classrooms are needed due to growth at LJCHS. The new classrooms will be single-story and expected to be located in front of the 1300 building.

Agenda Item 2M (Award use for Rytan, LLC using the 1GPA 18-15PV-11 Job Order Contract and H&B using 1GPA 18-15PV-08 Job Order Contract for the Security Lobby Remodels at Copper Canyon High School, Tolleson Union High School, Sierra Linda High School, La Joya Community High School and District Office)

• Mr. Calles shared that these remodels are needed to bring them up to our district safety standards set by West Point High School. However, Westview High School will be pushed back because the project is more extensive and would carryover deep into the school year.

Agenda Item 2N (Award use of Progressive Roofing for roofing replacement at Tolleson Union High School – Admin Building 100 using Mohave Cooperative Contract #18R-PRO-0418)

- Mr. Calles shared that the Tolleson Union High School Admin Building requires roofing replacement for safety reasons.
- Dr. Flores asked about roofing issues throughout the district.
- Mr. Calles responded that we are looking at the School Facility Board to ratify the roofing and weatherization project at Westview High School and we are trying to get that project completed as soon as approved and possible.

Agenda Item 20 (Award use for Urban Energy Solutions, Inc. using the 1GPA 17-13PV-05 Electrical and Lighting Products and Services Contract for the installation of sport lighting for the varsity softball field at La Joya Community High School)

- Dr. Flores asked what the difference is between Urban Energy Solutions and Midstate Energy.
- Mr. Calles explained that Urban Energy Solutions, focuses on electrical and lighting; and Midstate Energy, is focused on mechanical.

Agenda Item 2Q (Award use for Rytan, LLC using the 1GPA 18-15PV-11 Job Order Contract for the demolition of the pool at the Tolleson Union High School campus)

- Dr. Flores said that he is pleased to see the demolition of the pool because it is necessary. He asked about the future of the swimming pool in the scope of the facilities plan, not necessarily at TUHS, or an aquatic swimming pool in the district.
- The City of Tolleson may or may not build an aquatic center on their land.
- Dr. Flores asked to have a conversation in the near future regarding a district aquatic center that is AIA compliant and the value to the community and the district.
- Mr. Del Palacio thanked Dr. Flores for his questions about these projects. He shared that the Board has received updates and a list of projects and costs previously. He would like to receive additional information on these projects to understand the context of prioritizing projects and determining estimated costs.
- Mr. Calles shared that having Board approval tonight would allow them to move forward on these projects over the summer while students and staff are not on campuses to ensure their safety.
- Mr. Chapman would appreciate receiving a copy of the assessments.
- Superintendent Gutierrez will mail a copy of the capital plan to every Board member prior to the next board meeting.

- Mr. Villalon agrees with Dr. Flores and would like to know the game plan for the district in the future regarding a swimming pool. A conversation with the City of Tolleson would be beneficial.
- Superintendent Gutierrez said that she will follow up with the City of Tolleson again. At her last meeting with the City however, they said that they will build a community pool, not in partnership with TUHSD. The City also said that the district could use that facility as needed for swim teams.
- Dr. Flores said that we may need to wait until after the November elections for a conversation with the City of Tolleson, because there will be a significant change by then.

Mr. Chapman moved to approve adopting a Resolution ordering and calling a Special Budget Override Election to be held in and for the District and declaring the deadline for submitting arguments "For" and "Against" the election to the Maricopa County School Superintendent as August 7, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. and approving the Governing Board's argument in support of the Special Maintenance and Operation Budget Override Election; seconded by President Madruga. In a roll call vote, the motion carried 5-0.

8. Submission of Arizona School Boards Association (ASBA) Proposed Issues for Consideration for the 2021 Political Agenda; Appointment of Delegate and Alternate Delegate to Delegate Assembly

Administration seeks Governing Board consideration of proposed action agenda items for the Arizona School Board Association's (ASBA) 2021 Political Agenda. Additionally, the Governing Board is asked to appoint a Delegate and Alternate Delegate to the September 12, 2020 Delegate Assembly.

Mr. Chapman moved to approve submitting the same issues as 2019-2020 for Legislative Committee Consideration – 2021 Political Agenda for ASBA action (noted below). In addition, it is recommended that the Governing Board appoint Mr. Del Palacio as Delegate and Mr. Villalon as Alternate Delegate to the September 12, 2020 Delegate Assembly; seconded by Dr. Flores. In a roll call vote, the motion carried 5-0.

ASBA Proposed Issues for Consideration for the 2021 Political Agenda

- 1. Revise the School Finance formula to 1) provide a stable, dedicated revenue source less reliant on the general fund or annual legislative appropriation; 2) ensure the formula addresses the unique financial needs of schools to service students in poverty and rural schools.
- 2. Provide additional state funding for nationally competitive salaries to attract, recruit and retain talented teachers.
- 3. Oppose the expansion of Empowerment Scholarship Accounts (ESAs).
- 4. Fully restore 9th grade CTE/JTED eligibility and funding to allow students to explore career fields and/or certification completion.
- 5. Fully fund Special Education (Exceptional Student Services).

Additional Items for Consideration:

- 1. Invest in technology equitably for all students.
- 2. Oppose school district consolidation.
