- **TUHSD awaits clarity from the Arizona Interscholastic Association**

In an effort to clearly communicate to parents with regards to sports this school year, the Tolleson Union High School District provided updates to parents via the school athletic directors. The letter read in part, “The Tolleson Union High School District wants to provide clear and accurate information to our school and District communities regarding athletics for the 2020-2021 school year. The Tolleson Union High School District **WILL BE** participating in **ALL** athletics offered by the Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA) during school year 2020-2021.”

The letter goes on to say, “TUHSD is awaiting clarity from the AIA and the Arizona Department of Health Services regarding start dates for the fall season of athletics and in-person learning respectively. The AIA Executive Board is meeting this **Wednesday, August 5th**. The Arizona Department of Health Services is developing public health benchmarks for the safe return of in-person instruction and expects to share that information with the public and schools no later than **Friday, August 7th**.”
