

### **PROM DATE CHANGE TO MAY 22**

# ACCOUNTABILITY PAUSE FOR THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

In response to the evolving conditions under COVID-19, the department is planning to pause the state and federal accountability systems in the 2020-21 school year. On March 18, the Governor issued an Executive Order pausing both state assessments and state accountability to enable schools and districts to focus on providing alternative learning opportunities for students during this time. The department will work with the U.S. Department of Education to get additional flexibility on federal requirements.

# COVID-19 SYMPTOMS HELPFUL TOOLS JUST RELEASED

A useful free new app and website has just been launched that guides Americans through a series of questions about their health and exposure to determine whether they should seek care for COVID-19 symptoms. The tools provide CDC recommendations on next steps, including guidance on social distancing and self-isolating, how to closely monitor symptoms, recommendations on testing and when to contact a medical provider. These helpful guides are the result of a partnership with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the White House Coronavirus Task Force and Apple Inc.

# MR. SCHUCK'S MIDDLE SCHOOL SCIENCE CLASS

The past few weeks, my 7th grade classes have had the wonderful opportunity to participate in several science dissections. We dissected Fetal Pigs, Bullfrogs, Sheep Hearts, and Cow Eyeballs. We have been working in our "Cell" unit, (The basic unit of life), identifying important parts and functions of organisms. We then looked at each organism under the microscope and completed several different activities with the data we collected. These laboratory activities enabled students to see how cells, organs, and living things interact within a real organism. (an organism is a living thing made up of one or more cells and able to carry on the activities of life).......

I am extremely proud of every student as they worked very hard in understanding how "The Basic Unit of Life" works within the complexity of how organisms, tissues and organs are all interrelated. I know I enjoyed this lab as much as my students did.....
