

RELATIONS WITH EDUCATION RESEARCH AGENCIES

The Union Colony School Board recognizes the importance of research as a means of improving the instructional program for the school's students and also recognizes the need to monitor and control the amount of time and energy expended by both staff and students on research projects sponsored by agencies or individuals from inside and outside the school. Therefore, any agency or individual desiring to conduct research involving students, student records, student data, or staff members, must submit a written prospectus to the Director for review and approval of the School's management team prior to initiation of the study.

All research proposals must demonstrate that the projected findings will have value to the school, and not be unduly disruptive or time consuming to the normal educational process.

Agencies or individuals authorized to conduct research in the school shall hold Union Colony Schools harmless from any and all claims occurring out of the authorized project.

STUDENT TEACHING AND INTERNSHIPS

Union Colony School shall cooperate with institutions of higher education in teacher training programs in accordance with state law. Arrangements for such programs are made through the principal. Student teachers are not permitted to act in the capacity of a supervising teacher without the approval of the principal.
