



## How to set up QP Pastoral Care for a loved one who is hospitalized or has moved to a residential care setting, either temporarily or permanently:

We stand ready to serve and support you and your family. The QP Pastoral Care team of priests and lay ministers provides pastoral care services during and after a hospitalization, or while in a residential care center. Please share and discuss the following with your loved ones. Many parishioners have expressed how helpful this prayerful care and support has been to them in difficult times.

- **If you or a family member enters the hospital either by appointment or through the emergency room**, please inform the hospital that you belong to Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish and that you would like the hospital to list your parish on your record. If you do not inform the hospital, the hospital will not inform the QP Pastoral Care team.
- **If you don't wish to list your parish when you enter the hospital**, that is your choice and we respect your right to privacy. In this case, please notify us if you need and wish assistance upon return home.
- **If you are moving from the hospital or your home to a care center or assisted living facility, whether permanently or temporarily**, please let us know your new location, including new phone number, if applicable. We keep track of parishioners who reside in care facilities in order to make occasional visits and provide special outreach to them according to their needs.
- **If you or your loved one needs the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**, please call at the earliest opportunity to arrange for this.
- **If hospice care services begin for terminal illness**, please notify QP Pastoral Care.
