Dear Altar Valley Families,

Altar Valley School District (AVSD) will provide Remote Learning opportunities for students starting Thursday, August 6, 2020. At this time we do not know when schools will reopen for face-to-face instruction. As long as schools remain closed, AVSD will operate a Remote Learning model. During Remote Learning:

- Students will engage daily with their regularly assigned teacher. Daily engagement will be online or through other means, if necessary.
- Teachers will take attendance and provide interactive lessons.
- Lessons will include opportunities for practice and feedback.
- Intervention services will be provided for eligible students, including support for students who participate in Special Education as well as English Learners.

In order to ensure that we allocate resources properly, your teacher will be calling you starting Monday July 27 through July 30 to obtain valuable information as we plan for the start of school.
