Let's Build Something

It won't be long now and I'll be able to hear it. Saws buzzing, hammers pounding, supervisors calling out orders, and those unidentifiable thuds that leave you wondering if everything is still okay—these are the sounds of construction. Even better, they are the sounds of progress, and I cannot wait to hear them. At our April 7th Voters' Assembly Meeting we voted to move forward in starting construction on the 2nd floor of the FLC. That meeting has set a ball in motion that is rapidly picking up momentum. The contracts have been signed, the collected "junk upstairs" is being discarded, and we are looking at an official start date on or around June 1 with the project to be completed (if all goes well) by the end of the calendar year. When the sounds show up, we will all know what is taking place.

That's the way it is with construction. There is something gratifying about participating in it. There is something satisfying about being able to watch and see the progress day by day. First, you have the guts (the plumbing, the wiring, and the ductwork), then the glory (the walls, the doors, and the floors), and then the glamour (the fresh paint, the furnishings, and the new technology). If only spiritual progress was as easy as signing contracts and waiting for the accompanying sights and sounds to show up. The signs of construction progress are easy to

identify; the signs of spiritual progress are more clandestine in nature. Because the signs of construction are so obvious, they attract our eye. If we are not careful, they will attract and consume our focus as well.

In 2 Peter 5:1-8 the apostle Peter encourages us to add certain qualities to our faith. The way that he describes adding these qualities to faith is comparable to the various steps and phases of construction. He speaks of adding one spiritual quality on top of the other, on top of the other; he writes, "For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." As we watch the construction progress taking shape upstairs—the plumbing, wiring, ductwork, walls, doors, floors, paint, furnishings and smart boards—let's keep our focus on the spiritual progress that Christ is working inside us—the faith, goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, mutual affection, and love. Pray that our building construction runs smoothly and that our spiritual progress in Christ outshines our, soon to be, shiny new space.

WORSHIP | GROW | ENGAGE is the focus of Grace Lutheran's discipleship process. We need to be intentional to take an assessment of how we are doing individually and corporately in supporting this process. We are in the Easter season and this is a time of victory and celebration. Think about your willingness to be involved in sharing a message of hope. The Gospel message makes a difference in daily life. Jesus lived to save each of us through His death and resurrection. Are you ready to share the Easter hope with your family, friends, and neighbors?

Michael Kelley reports on research done by LifeWay that identified eight domains of the Christian life that lead to spiritual health in a believer. These attributes of discipleship serve as signposts on the pathway of discipleship. In other words, these are the characteristics that ought to be present, in increasing measure, in the life of someone who is growing toward Christlikeness.

8 CRITICAL SIGNPOSTS OF A HEALTHY CHURCH

- 1. Bible engagement: Transformation can be recognized when our mind is sharpened by the Bible, our perspective is shaped by the Bible, and our actions are directed by the
- 2. Obeying God and denying self: Discipleship is the process of obedience to one who is in authority over you. Transformation can be seen when we progressively set aside earthly delights for kingdom priorities.
- 3. Serving God and others: Transformation is evident when personal needs and even dreams are set aside for the needs we see in others.
- 4. Sharing Christ: Even with the need to live out the effects of the gospel, maturing believers know speaking about the message is a necessity. Transformation is evident when we talk about the source of it.
- 5. Exercising faith: Transformation is seen in believers when risk aversion is set aside and our lives are characterized by faithful obedience to God's will.
- 6. Seeking God: Transformation is seen when our desire is to know God more deeply and experience His work more fully.
- 7. Building relationships: Our faith is personal but it is not intended to be private. Our horizontal relationships should develop just as our vertical relationship with God does. Transformation occurs when relational maturity is evident in our lives.
- 8. Unashamed: Transformation is evident when a believer is unashamed to present their own life as being aligned with Christ.

As the signposts of the discipleship pathway, these are the statistically validated marks of transformation that show people are on the right track. They are growing disciples of Jesus, and that growth is displayed through attributes like those mentioned.



hands to do the Lord's work! Cost is \$7 per person with breakfast snacks and lunch provided.




