

**Lake-Lehman School District Position on  
Grading Calculations and Procedures During the Mandated School Closures  
April 20, 2020 through June 5, 2020**

We have given considerable thought as how to best calculate grades for the Third and Fourth marking periods. The belief at Lake-Lehman is that community, grace and affirmation take precedence to grades as we help students master the remaining curriculum content with meaningful teacher feedback. Because we cannot ensure the integrity or validity of grades during online learning, our goal is to hold students harmless and take this time to dig deeper into the content of our core subject areas. We want to do all this while supporting the emotional well-being of each child during the COVID-19 pandemic.

**Marking Period 3:**

While we support the notion that all students should be held harmless academically during the crisis, we must also recognize that seven weeks of work were completed during the third marking period.

- All students will be afforded the opportunity to complete extra credit or make up work for the marking period – Deadline May 1
- Calculation of third quarter final average will consist of previously earned grades and any extra-credit and make-up work.

**Marking Period 4:**

- Student will have the opportunity to earn 100% for marking period 4 if they PARTICIPATE 2 TIMES PER WEEK PER CLASS.
- The expectation for “Specials” is one meeting per week.  
Elementary: (Art, Music, PE, Innovation and Computers)  
Junior/Senior HS: (PE)
- Participation can be joining a Zoom session, turning in an assignment in Google Classroom, uploading a picture of work they have completed or corresponding with their respective teacher via email to complete a task, etc.
- If a student DOES NOT participate at least 2 times per week per class, they will receive a 70% for the Fourth Quarter.

**There will be no incompletes issued for MP 3 or MP 4. We understand there can and will be extenuating circumstances under the guidelines of this scenario. Please communicate with your teacher, guidance counselor or building principal if you experience any difficulties accessing or completing academic material in this new educational platform.**
