We want it to feel that way when your children walk through these doors.

Another very important aspect to us is our students' safety while at school. We have been doing much work toward updating the district's Safe School Plan, expanding our collaboration with local police and fire departments, and implementing an emergency preparedness plan to ensure students have the training to work with teachers, staff and classmates to increase their safety in the unlikely event of an attack. The district has partnered with ALICE - an acronym for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate. No one wants to find themselves in the presence of danger whether at school or the movies or the mall. However, we all want our children to be equipped to have the best chance of survival. This is why we are improving your child's preparedness through the leading and most effective training.

As we get ready for a new school year, I want to draw your attention to the importance of school attendance. Did you know that absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year? Did you know poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade? Did you know that by 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school? Finally, did you know that research shows missing 10% of the school year negatively affects a student's academic performance? That's just about two days per month!

Encouraging regular school attendance is one of the most powerful ways you can prepare your child for success – both in school and in life. **WE NEED YOUR HELP!** When you help us make school attendance a priority, you help your child get better grades, develop healthy life habits, and have a better chance of graduating from high school ready to successfully meet all the challenges life may have in store for them! Please help us, help your child to make daily school attendance a priority! Thank you!
