

Frequently Asked Questions about SUSD Schools Reopening Plan

Question: Will school open on August 17th, 2020?

Answer: Our current plan is for school to begin on Monday, August 17th either in-person or through remote-learning. If conditions change we will make sure parents are quickly informed.

Question: What if I am uncomfortable with sending my child to school at the beginning of the school year?

Answer: SUSD remains committed to meeting your child's needs. We will be offering remote learning options for students at all grade levels. Please contact your child's school for more info.

Question: What do you mean by remote-learning?

Answer: SUSD has purchased electronic devices for every student. Students will be able to log-in and attend their class remotely using Microsoft Teams. We will also use a Learning Management System where assignments and lessons will be posted. Packets will also be available for the younger grades. Teachers will be communicating weekly with all students.

Question: Will students be screened for symptoms indicating they may expose others to COVID-19?

Answer: Students will be self-assessed daily when we come in contact with them. For bus riders this will be when they board the bus. For other students it will be when they come onto campus. Students exhibiting symptoms will be isolated until a parent, guardian or emergency contact can be contacted.

Question: Will students be required to wear masks at school?

Answer: Based on the Town of Superior Mayor's Executive Order, students and staff will be required to wear any type of face covering unless otherwise determined by a medical excuse.

Question: Will students wash their hands frequently at school?

Answer: Students will have many opportunities during the school day to wash their hands either with soap and water or with hand sanitizer.

Question: Will the school be engaging in additional activities aimed at killing any germs?

Answer: SUSD is investing in equipment that will be used to disinfect all areas where students are present each day including buses, classrooms, offices, restrooms and hallways. SUSD is also contracting with a cleaning company in order to conduct "deep cleanings."

Question: How will Superior Schools meet the needs of students with learning disabilities?

Answer: Special Education teachers will confer individually with parents to discuss steps needed to ensure the unique needs of each student are met in an appropriate way based on the their disability.

Question: Where will students eat breakfast/lunch?

Answer: JFK students will be eating Breakfast/Lunch in the Classrooms. Students in grades 7-12 will be allowed to eat in the Multi-Purpose Room provided they could adequately practice social-distancing procedures. If students are learning remotely, breakfast/lunch could either be picked-up at designated bus stops or in-person at the high school from our drive-through service.
