LETTER ACTIVITIES

Uppercase Letter Cards

- Use as flashcards show the letter cards one at a time and have your child name each letter. See how fast you can go! It's fun to use a stopwatch and try to beat your time!
- Put letter cards in order from A to Z.
- Read alphabet from A to Z; then read it backwards from Z to A.

Lowercase Letter Cards

- Use as flashcards show the letter cards one at a time and have your child name each *lettersound*.
- Put letter cards in order from a to z.
- Read alphabet from a to z; then read it backwards from z to a.
- Put the letter cards in a container (bag, box, or can). Draw one letter card and <u>say the sound</u> of the letter. Think of words that begin with that letter sound. For example, a is for apple, astronaut, ant, alligator. (If you have a die/dice, you could roll it to decide how many words to think of for each letter.)

Uppercase and Lowercase Letter Cards

• Put uppercase letter cards in order from A to Z and then draw a lowercase letter card to match to the corresponding uppercase letter.

• Memory game – choose about 8 matching uppercase and lowercase letter cards and place them upside-down in rows on a table. First player turns over 2 cards and <u>names the letters</u>. If the letters match, that player keeps the pair and plays again. If the letters don't match, the cards are turned upside-down and the next player has a turn. (This game can be made more challenging by using more letter cards but don't use all 26 letters!)
