HORATIO ALGER ASSOCIATION

- Criteria:
 - Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the United States
 - Demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income is required)
 - Be involved in co-curricular and community service activities
 - Display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity
 - Maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0; and
 - Be a United States citizen
- Award:
 - Various: Several Scholarships Available

COCA COLA SCHOLARS- Please note there are 3 separate scholarships available on this website.

- Criteria:

- U.S. Citizens, U.S. Nationals, U.S. Permanent Residents, Refugees, Asylees, Cuban-Haitian Entrants, or Humanitarian Parolees - based on the guidelines utilized by U.S. Department of Education for Federal Financial Aid eligibility
- Will receive high school diploma during current academic year
- Planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution
- Award:
 - Varies- \$1,500-\$20,000

PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARD

- Criteria:
 - Any student who is in grades 5-12 and a legal resident of one of the US.
 - Any student who has engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least in part after September 1, 2019
 - Completes an application and submits it to the school principal by November 10, 2020
- Award:
 - Varies- starting at \$1,000
- Application:

- **DEADLINE: November 10, 2020**

THE DANIELS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- Criteria:
 - Be a high school senior graduating from a school in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
 - Be a resident of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
 - Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
 - Earn a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.0 in high school (on an unweighted 4.0 scale), AND earn a minimum SAT Math score of 490 and a minimum Evidence-Based Reading & Writing score of 490, or a minimum ACT score of 18 in each category (writing score not required). Super scoring is not accepted.
 - For students who were unable to take the SAT or ACT due to COVID-19 cancellations, they are eligible to apply with a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.3 in high school (on an unweighted 4.0 scale), and do not need to provide standardized test scores.
- Award:
 - Varies- scholarship functions as an unmet need or "last dollar" scholarship

DELL SCHOLARS

- Criteria:
 - 2.4 grade point average
 - Dell Scholars targets low-income, highly motivated students who are better than their numbers indicate and demonstrate the drive to succeed despite personal obstacles. The ideal candidate will demonstrate a unique "GPA" of grit, potential, and ambition in their quest for a college education.
- Award:
 - \$20,000
- Application: **Opens October 1, 2020**

GE-REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- Criteria:
 - Demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship
 - Demonstrate strong academic performance (minimum 3.0 grade point average/4.0 scale or equivalent)
 - Be citizens of the United States of America
 - Be current high school seniors attending high school in the United States (students living on U.S. Armed Forces base and homeschooled students are also eligible)
 - Plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study toward a bachelor's degree at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States for the entire upcoming academic year.
- Award:
 - \$10,000/year for 4 years = \$40,000 total
