Any child from birth to 36 months who is developmentally delayed, as defined by the state, can be referred to the Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP)

BEGIN?

Interventions with young children and family members must be based on explicit principles, validate practices, best available research and relevant laws and regulations.



Upon initial referral to AzEIP, an Individualized Family Service Plan must be developed for an eligible child within 45 days

Role of Providers



Provide support with occupational, physical or speech therapy, developmental special instruction, social work, or psychological services

Role of Parent/Guardian



Provide information about your child's development, health, and medical history, share any family concerns, interests, and priorities

Role of the State



Provide a service coordinator and other community resources; develop outcomes for your child and family to support your child's learning and participation at home and in the community
