Dear TUSD Parents/Guardians,

The 2020-2021 SY is going to be a very fluid and rapidly changing year. With this, the food service department is going to be working diligently to provide food services throughout our district that not only meet and exceed the state and federal standards for the National School Lunch Program. In providing these standards we have put together a foodservice plan for each school site individually. This plan has been put together with all CDC guidance in mind to help mitigate the impact that COVID-19 will have on how we operate and function in our program this year. It has been made in conjunction with the district foodservice director, site administrators and our foodservice management company, A'Vaiaids.

With the approval of in-person learning at the board meeting on Wednesday evening, Friday, August 14, 2020 will be the last day that we will be delivering food via buses at any of our sites within the district. We will, however, be offering curbside to any and all currently enrolled students at our schools. It is important to understand that any student can pick up food at any of our sites. That means that high school students that live in Huachuca City can pick-up their meals at the elementary school. The times will be as follows:

Huachuca City School: 7:40 A.M. – 8:10 A.M.
Tombstone High School: 7:45 A.M. – 8:00 A.M.
Walter J Meyer (once it reopens): 7:45 A.M. – 8:00 A.M.

There will be a carry-over eligibility of 30 operating days per state regulations for all high school students. Which means that all students will receive free meals until September 29, 2020. That means that on September 29, all students that have not completed a lunch application for free or reduced meals will automatically transition to a paid status. As with last year, all enrolled elementary school students will be provided free meals because of the community eligibility program (CEP).

A note to all high school parents, if you have not already done so, please follow this link, <https://www.nlappscloud.com> and complete a lunch application. This will help us to get a well-rounded picture of our district and hopefully get the entire district on the CEP for next year. The income thresholds change every year so just because you didn't qualify last year does not mean that you won't qualify this year.

Meals times and service schedules have been arranged with each site individually and will be changed and adjusted based off of the needs of the school. Please keep in mind that our menus are subject to change without notice based off of availability of product.

A'viands has been training their staff on enhanced cleaning and sanitizing procedures to ensure the safety and overall well-being of our staff and students while enjoying their meals.
