BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY**

BOARD COMMITTEES

The Board of Trustees shall appoint members to District committees each December. Board members may serve, as assigned, on standing, special, district, and community committees according to the District's needs and policy. On occasion, committee assignment or reassignment may be necessary and is permissible due to board vacancies or to serve the District's needs.

No committee shall have the authority to obligate the District financially nor shall they exercise executive authority without consent of the Board. The Board may also appoint individual members to serve as liaisons with various organizations or as representatives on district or inter-district committees.

District Committees include committees who work on an ongoing basis throughout the year in an effort to improve the District. Board members assigned to these committees are typically liaisons. Examples of such committees include but are not limited to Participatory Management Council Classified and Certified, Activities Committee, Insurance Committee, Health, Wellness and Food Service, Facilities, Technology, and Transportation.

Standing Committees shall be limited in use, but may be established by the Board of Trustees for a specific purpose or need. Standing Committees shall have scope and powers established by the Board, shall be made up of designated Trustees selected by the Board and may also include representatives from administration, staff and community stakeholders. Standing Committees shall remain in effect until such time as the Board changes or disbands the Standing Committee. Examples of Standing Committees include, but are not limited to 3x3 and Curriculum Coordinating Council.

Special Committees may be established by the Board to examine and make recommendations on a specific subject or to complete a specific task. Special Committees are dissolved once the task is completed. Special Committees shall have a scope of work, a timeframe in which the work is to be completed and shall have the duty to report back to the Board as a whole on the findings of their work. Special Committees can include Board Members as well as other stakeholders. The composition, scope, function and authority of each Special Committee should be established by the Board prior to operating.

Community Committees include those committees established by community partners or other governmental agencies or entities in which a Trustee is a member. The Board of Trustees appoint Board Members to these committees. In some cases the Board Member is a voting member of the Committee. Examples of Community Committees include, but are not limited to the Shoshone Recreation District Board, and the Northwest BOCES Board.

It shall be the policy of the Board of Trustees that no member shall serve more than two consecutive appointed years on any established committee with the exception of community committees in which board members may serve no more than one appointed term.
