Mammoth-San Manuel PreK-12 Distance Learning Plan

To start the school year, we will provide online classroom instruction for all students until they are allowed back to school based on county and state benchmarks. Our teachers are highly qualified to provide a rigorous online educational experience for the student learner. Though we prefer to have students at their school and in their classrooms, the health and safety of our students and staff is our number one priority.

The Mammoth-San Manuel Prek-12 Distance Learning Program will consist of online participation with classroom teachers and paraprofessionals.

Families should follow their classroom teacher's schedule for how the day will go: PreK has 30-40 minute recordings available from 8:30 AM-7:00 PM to give students/parents the supervised time to complete the work (homework to follow the recording that should take approx. 30 minutes); Elementary 8:30-2:25 (with a 30 min. lunch); and Jr./Sr. High School 8:00 AM-3:00 PM with a 30 min. lunch (except for varying schedules for Juniors and Seniors).

Edgenuity and Google Classrooms will be used as the online platform.

Special Education Teachers will support student learning through in class and pull out support.

Related Services (PT, OT, and Speech Therapy) will provide teletherapy.

Technology Supports:

All students in grades Kindergarten through 12th grade will be given a school device (iPads for PreK-2, chromebooks for 3-12)

Hotspots are available for families who do not currently have Internet services or students without Internet/hotspots can schedule to be part of the On-Site Program. Hotspots are located at the Mammoth and the San Manuel Public Libraries as well as the Mammoth Community Center.

There is a Technology Help form on the website that can be filled out for any help needed with technology. We ask that students first reach out to their teachers for help then fill out this form for further assistance. (Topics include login difficulties and other student technology questions. 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Teachers will have the option of teaching from their classrooms to allow for the use of their school tools and access to our internet.

Expectations for Students

Attendance will be taken daily for all students.

Grades will be given based on the work that students complete and the effort that they put into their work.

Students who do not attend class will be marked absent; absences will impact a student's overall grade point average.

Students who do not complete the assigned work will not be given passing grades.

Any student who does not attend school for 10 consecutive days will be dropped from enrollment.

Students who have excess absences will be reported to the truancy officer, following discipline from their site administration.

All school rules apply online as they do at the school site and in the classroom buildings.

If students need extra help they need to contact their individual teachers and try to set up extra time on Wednesdays to be part of the intervention program.
