#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

This past spring, I was faced with an unpopular decision of having to cut down one of the many Live Oak trees surrounding my house. Working with a local Arborist and in conjunction with my next-door neighbor, we devised a plan for the safe removal of the tree and the grinding down of the four foot stump that would be left in the wake of such a project. It was a necessary action given that over the years the tree had grown to the point of damaging my neighbor's house in the past, and now the root ball of this magnificent tree was beginning to protrude from the ground threatening to take my home's foundation with it. The project was a grand success and we discovered through the process that the inner core was diseased and had weakened its stability. Yet, as the Arborist pointed out, the size of the roots for holding the tree were never in question. After time, he assured me that the growing mound of roots would soon decay, and my yard would even-out. After all these months the mound is less and less noticeable and my yard is becoming level once again.

And yet, as strange as that may sound, it got me thinking as we prepare to enter the Fall season and the month of October, just how important the roots were to that huge tree to keep it from falling in some of the most intense storms over the years. I can only imagine their intricate design and the strength they forged that gave life to this tree. I'm reminded of Paul's word to the Colossians in 2:6-7 where he states, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in Him, rooted and built up in Him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." In other words, would you join with me in saying, "Let's give thanks to God for our roots in October?" Why our roots – why in October, you ask? Because that's when we traditionally remember the founding of the Lutheran Church and celebrate the blessings and joy of the Reformation! It's the time when we thank God for rooting us in a congregation that is firmly rooted in the teaching of the "Three Solas" or pillars of the Reformation commonly referred to as; "Sola Gratia (Grace Alone); Sola Fides (Faith Alone); and Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone!). In short, we thank God for rooting us in Christ Alone!

As many of you know, October 31 is traditionally a day to dress up in costumes and travel from door to door asking for candy, but for many Christians, especially those of the Lutheran tradition, October 31, is celebrated as Reformation Day. On this day we celebrate God's work through His servant Martin Luther, to preserve the message of the Gospel as the free-gift of God's grace in Jesus Christ through faith alone. It was in 1517 that Martin Luther nailed his "95 Theses" or disputes to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. The Theses were written against the teachings of indulgences, purgatory, and other beliefs and practices that were inconsistent with the clear teachings of the Bible. The church was selling God's gift of the forgiveness of sins that was intended to be free. Luther's resistance to this was seen as a threat by the leaders of the church and the clash eventually led him to be labeled a heretic and excommunicated. As a result, Luther took his reform movement outside of the church in order to preserve the true teachings as those being rooted in the Bible.

Is this sense of a Reformation still needed today? Pastor Robin Fish explains the answer to this question well when he states, "So today, the world needs to meet Christians who know the solid foundation of Christ, which is only solid when you see your sins and the great danger they present and repent of them, and then to know Christ, and His grace and forgiveness, and genuinely trust in Him. For some of you, that sounds like the religion you already have, and you wonder why we even need a reformation. Well, not everyone needs to turn back to the true foundation because they never left it – for which we owe God great thanks. Church after church, and denomination after denomination have left it though. So, the reformation is still needed!"

Won't you take the time this month to remember the Reformation and the core teachings that stand as the roots of our foundation that were preserved by God through Martin Luther? And may that message of the 3-Solas (Grace Alone; Faith Alone, and Scripture Alone) draw you ever closer to that new life of faith – a transformed life – that's found only in Christ Alone! Yes, these are the roots Paul was referring to – these roots bring us life and forgiveness and stability for living our daily lives in Him – here, we're being built and strengthened in our faith, and overflowing with thankfulness!" That's giving thanks to God for our roots this October!





They are equally excited about staying with us to help with quilts, and in particular the Christmas stocking project which we will begin shortly.

We have also been blessed with Debbie Sattler joining our fellowship. Welcome Debbie! Evelyn Schultz, a long time Scrappy quilter member is moving to Texas at the end of the month. We will miss her and wish her well. In preparing her house to put on the market she gave us a very generous donation of her fabric stash. There was so much fabric I felt compelled to share some of it with 3 other sewing charities in the Villages: The Giving Dolls, Operation Shoebox, and the Bear Ladies. Thank you Evelyn! Your donation is going a long way to bless others! The Giving Dolls felt led to return the favor by donating to the Scrappy Quilters some of the Christmas fabric in their stash for us to sew Christmas stockings for the SOZO kids!

Over the summer I was led to share 40 of the crib sized quilt tops I had pieced over the summer with the ladies at Christ Lutheran Mantua, Ohio, who desired to start a quilting ministry. The Ladies Guild provided the funds for purchase of batting and other items needed. One of my sisters in the Lord there was able to match up backs from fabrics she and her mother had in their stash! 

Evens, but not odds. It's the way our family recalls the years that we are blessed to travel back to the U.S. Alas, the summer of 2019 did not take the four of us over the ocean, but instead we were blessed by friends who came to us. Some we had not seen for many years and others - who live just across the sprawling metropolis of Seoul - that we see all too infrequently. Across Seoul we ventured with homemade meals to spend an afternoon with Korean friends we first met in the middle of an lowan comfield, at Mission Central, several years ago. The mother, now recovering from cancer treatments, says she feels the prayers of us - and many others - though she hasn't confessed faith in Christ. We shared with her again the hope we have in Christ, our Redeemer and the greatest Physician. The next week we excitedly welcomed friends from Down Under who emigrated from Korea to Australia with their two young boys. It was their first visit back to Seoul since they left three years ago and we enjoyed catching up at church and over lunch at our home - marveling at the boys' cute new accents and Aussie English vocabulary. (Turns out "Please pass the capsicums" translates to "Pass the bell peppers." We had no idea!) We remember well their first Sunday at our local congregation of International Lutheran Church (ILC), and soon after watching both their boys be baptized. Another friend who was baptized several years ago at ILC stayed with us for a few days as he traveled from his home in the Czech Republic to finish up his post-graduate studies in New Zealand. Encouraging him in his still young faith is very important to our whole family. Others visited too, including former and current church members, for meals, chats and even for cooking lessons. We are blessed beyond measure with a God who cares for us and provides a community for us here in Seoul, extending to you our dear friends, family, and network of support, encouragement and genuine love and concern. We are excited about this upcoming fall season and the opportunities ahead. Please continue to pray that we may be faithful in our calling to serve in this place for the sake of the Gospel. And, as always, thank you immensely for your partnership.

#### HORNES OF A DILEMMA

The 12<sup>th</sup> chapter of the Gospel of John is considered an enigma. The reason being is simple, well maybe not so simple. You see, the first eleven verses of the 12<sup>th</sup> chapter do not appear in what is believed to be the oldest manuscripts. Now, to me and many, all that means is that it is not found in the oldest known manuscript. Others believe, and maybe rightfully so, that the story was added by a scribe many years later. Either way, there are two questions that need to be asked. One, is it in line with the character of Jesus? And, two, does it fit with all the other stories in which Jesus had interaction with others? I believe it does in both cases.

The story in question is about the woman caught in the very act of adultery. However, the act of adultery is not the main point of the story; that being, to put Jesus on the horns of a dilemma. Here is the dilemma, the law of Moses states that the woman should be stoned (along with the man but he is nowhere to be found). The priest and his cohorts in crime ask Jesus if He thinks the woman should be stoned. If He says yes, then all the love stuff and forgiveness he has been talking about go out the window. If He states that she should be forgiven, then He is putting Himself above the law. Either way, they think they have Him. But wait a minute. Not so fast. Jesus bends down and starts doodling in the sand. What he is doodling is not important; it is what happens while He is doodling that is.

It occurred to me one time when I was preparing a sermon on this passage that you do not go fishing without a pole. You do not go play basketball without a ball. And, you do not go to an adulteress woman stoning without a rock. While Jesus in doodling, "Herman," the high priest is tossing his rock up and down in his hand just waiting to unleash it upon the woman. When Jesus saw the shadow of the rock being tossed up and down, He with cat like moves springs to His feet, grabs the rock in midflight, and brings it to bear right smack dab under Herman's noise. Jesus then looks Herman in the eye and proceeds to inform him that if he is without sin, he may proceed with throwing the stone. Herman bows his head and sheepishly walks off along with **all** the others. End of story, hardly.

The two main characters are now alone. Jesus takes off His robe and puts it around the naked woman. (Remember she was caught in the very act.) He bends downs, places His finger under chin, lifts her head and asks; "where are you accusers?" They were nowhere to be found. Then Jesus tells her to go and sin no more or in my looser translation; "try not to do this again."

To me, this is the most important story in the Bible about forgiveness. Others may argue, but once again I said "to me." You see what Jesus is telling us in this story is that the law of love is greater than any other. Please remember, when asked, Jesus stated the law of love is the greatest law of all. We are to love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, soul and strength. Then we are to love our neighbor as ourselves. The reason Jesus could forgive the woman is His love for her. We ask forgiveness from God because we have already forgiven those who have sinned against us. We forgive and forget because we are forgiven and God places our sins in the middle of His back.

As liturgical people, each week we confess that we are sinners, and each week we receive forgiveness pronounced by the priest. At Hope United Methodist Church in Poway, CA they do it a little differently. After confessing their sins, the priest pronounces that their sins are forgiven, then the congregation responds, your sins are forgiven. Forgiven and forgiving, just the way it was meant to be. Not that we have it wrong, but maybe they have it right. Something to consider. Your sins are forgiven.

UPDATES PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor Dan reported that there will be around 11 new members this fall. Also, that Trinity South is strong, solid. Pastor Blair stated that some of the small groups started this last week. There are currently 10 small groups. Trinity South is going to receive some more advertising through the Board of Evangelism. Members of Trinity South would like to see either a separate notice in the paper on Saturday, or a more predominant message. There needs to be more focus on making improvements at Trinity South. Also, there were discussions about advertising in the movie theatres. Gil Dahnke was asked to bring details to the next meeting.

#### **BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT:**

COUNCIL

Jill Esposito reported that a Hurricane Relief Effort notice was in the Bulletin. Donations have been received. There is a miscellaneous line item under the Board of Human Care's Missions that can be used to help for unexpected things like hurricanes. She would like to see a portion of those funds be sent along with the donations we received. Gary Eckoff moved: MOTION: Council shall approve donating \$2,000 from the Board of Human Care's Missions – Miscellaneous to the Hurricane Dorian Relief Effort through the Synod. Chuck Wilt seconded. Motion carried. There may be some advertising in The Daily Sun about donating to Hurricane Dorian Relief through the Synod.

Jill is working on getting some information together for a Nominating Committee. However, she needs input from all of the Boards as to how many (if any) people are going to be needed for their respective Boards. They need to communicate with her as soon as possible so that she can arrange for the appropriate number of members for the Nominating Committee. New member classes begin this week. The Rock is going very well. Requested donations for The Rock are published in the Bulletins each week.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Bob Behrends would like action taken on Procurement Guidelines that were distributed at the June Council Meeting. Bob moved: MOTION: Council shall accept the Procurement Guidelines as attached. Gary Eckoff took those Guidelines to the Finance Committee for their review. The Finance Committee agreed that the guidelines were valid, but also stipulated that they are currently being followed and saw no reason to make them a part of the Policy and Procedures Manual. For lack of a second, the motion was not voted on

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Pam Bixler shared that an e-mail was received by the Pastors and our Music Director regarding the Martin Luther High School Choir Tour 2020. Their group would like to perform at the church on Sunday, March 15, 2020. Pam has volunteered to take the lead on this project if approved by Council. Therefore, Pam moved: MOTION: Trinity Lutheran Church shall extend an invitation to Martin Luther High School Choir and Troubadours of Greendale, Wisconsin to perform at the church on Sunday, March 15, 2020. Gil Dahnke seconded. Details regarding time, expenses (i.e., meals, advertising, sound techs, etc.) and budget, will be worked out over the next couple of months and shared with the Council. Motion was approved.

Gary Eckoff received a letter last year regarding the Budget presentation to the Congregation. There was some dissatisfaction about how the final process was presented. Gary asked whether or not the final Budget Review Process could take place in the Sanctuary and allow members to attend. Pastor Dan responded that he would not support that idea, as the Budget Review Process is the Council's job. The congregation counts on the Council to make informed decisions regarding budget matters. Gary also suggested that we could pass out 3 X 5 index cards for the folks to write down questions. That idea was not supported either. The congregation is given ample opportunity to review the final budget package and ask questions at the Voter's meeting in December. When the final budget package is available, it will be

announced in the Bulletin (usually several weeks before the Voter's Meeting) and the Pastors will mention it during the announcements portion of the service.

To allow enough time for the approved budget to be completed, copied, and ready for distribution, the November Council meeting will be moved to the 12<sup>th</sup>.

<u>ATTENDANCE REPORTS</u>: The attendance report from Al Etzler for August 2019 was distributed. Gil Dahnke suggested that the usher count be discontinued. The numbers are just there for "trends" and do not need to be exact. Gary would like to see the usher count continue. Chuck Wilt will take this issue to the next Elder's meeting for discussion and a decision will be made at that time.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

Elders: Chuck Wilt reviewed the Holiday Schedule.

**Evangelism**: Bob Behrends reported the July 4<sup>th</sup> event for Veterans was very successful. Around 600 people attended. They have had many great suggestions for the next event. Mailings to new homeowners continued with about 2,000 pieces. Bob accepted Donna Battard's resignation from the Board, and President Bill Myers appointed Jan Garner to the Board of Evangelism.

**Human Care:** Martha Mitchell shared that the Board had the pleasure of assisting the Etzler's during their time of need. A lot of Blessing Bags have been distributed. They are in need of Emergency Responders at all services, but especially the 10:30 AM Sunday and the 4:00 PM Saturday services. She also reported that LouAnn and Hugh O'Brien will not be able to continue assisting the Board of Evangelism with the Welcome Center scheduling. Therefore, Martha turned over materials pertinent to that ministry to Bob Behrends. They will be collecting money for the Community of Gratitude Thanksgiving Dinners.

**Trinity South:** Gary Horton informed Council (via e-mail – copy attached), that he would no longer be representing Trinity South at the Council meetings. Dennis Esch has agreed to, temporarily, assume that responsibility.

*Trustees*: Lester Boretsky reported that Dennis Esch would like to join the Board of Trustees. President Bill Myers made that appointment.
