Social/Emotional Learning

The district will create a plan that supports the needs of the students and staff to enhance the social and emotional needs for all. It will be important to understand and make available resources to support this need. The district has created a subcommittee this August to create a process to review the needs of students/staff, create resources, and have ongoing conversations with stakeholders to ensure that we are supporting the whole child. This team is charged with the following tasks:

- 1. Ensure that best practices are in place
- 2. Mandate school-level outreach to at-risk students (those with previously identified mental health issues)
- 3. Consider procurement of additional mental health assessment services including crisis management support
- 4. Set district-wide health guidelines, train and assist in follow up protocols
- 5. Provide guidance to schools for changes to school-based health screening
- 6. Provide information to support students, parents and staff in regards to educating the whole child

This plana nd resources will be communicated out to all eLearning families by the beginning of September. Always feel free to reach out to your school's counselor or principal for help at any time.

eLearning Summary

As a district, we have used digital learning to help drive and enhance instruction through the district's 1:1 initiative for the past 8 years. Teachers use a learning management system to post and collect instructional materials and assignments. Teachers are accessible in case students have questions, and sometimes collaborate through the program. eLearning allows us as a district to use a similar digital learning format that we use in our classrooms daily, but now can continue instruction during an interruption in physical attendance that affects attendance in schools outside a classroom environment.

The district will ensure that the necessary pieces are in place to offer eLearning, including any needed wifi hot spots if needed. The plan will look differently in grades PreSchool, Kindergarten through 2nd grade, 3rd grade through 6th grade and 7th grade through 12th grade.

- Instructional content will be designed to align with curriculum guide that enforces grade level state standards
- The state standards will be aligned to the district pacing guides
- Students will have both online and off-line learning activities
- The primary tools for communication between the teachers and the families will be Schoology/online platform
- Teachers will have the option to live stream lessons, record lesson ahead of time, or record lesson during instruction and post instruction in a timely manner
- Regardless of delivery of instruction teachers will share their sessions online daily
- Grading will follow the district grading policy

Content Delivery	 Hybrid of materials will be picked up by student/family, emailed home or posted on Schoology to support students work on grade level state standards in all subject areas
Interaction	 Teachers will communicate with students the routine and timeline in regards to their mode of instruction Teachers will have the option to live stream, record lesson ahead of time or record lesson during instruction Students are expected to complete all sessions/assignments that are given by the teacher by the due dates Feedback will be timely from teacher

 to assist families. Other classroom assessments will be assigned at the discretion of the
 teacher.
- Students in grades 3-6 will need to participate in NSCAS assessments in Spring 2021 if they
 are enrolled in SPCS. Information about these assessments and scheduling will be provided in
 the spring.
- Additional help for students in grades K-6 will be communicated once school is up and running.

- The primary tools for communication between the teachers and the families will be Schoology/other
- Teachers will have the option to live stream, record lesson ahead of time or record lesson during instruction
- Regardless of delivery of instruction teachers will share their sessions online
