

On-Site Support Plan for Snowflake Unified School District #5

On June 24, 2020, Governor Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-41 *Prioritizing Kids and Schools During COVID-19* regarding the reopening of schools for school year 2020-2021. As part of the Executive Order, all public schools may submit a Distance Learning Plan (DLP) to receive the flexibility to offer distance learning options for students without an approved Arizona Online Instruction (AOI) program for the 2020-2021 school year. School districts are required to provide and describe their mitigation plan for on-site support services or in-person instruction.

Snowflake Unified School District (SUSD) is planning to reopen school starting August 17, 2020 for in-person instruction. SUSD will implement protective measures and sanitizing procedures

- Describe the efforts the school district will make to ensure all enrolled students have the availability of on-site options for students participating in online or distance learning.

SUSD intends to ensure the availability of on-site options for students participating in online or distance learning options through the following methods, at all of its school site locations:

When a student is dropped off at school for on-site support services, they will be placed in a safe and sanitized location i.e. a computer lab or library, where they will be monitored by a Paraprofessional or other appropriate staff who will supervise the student as they participate in their online or remote learning experience, but can also provide supplemental assistance.</p> <p>2. The student can continue to attend in this manner as long as the student is participating in online/distance learning options and the parents need this support and/or the student returns to in-person instruction at the school.</p> <p>3. The Online Coordinator/Teacher, Case Managers, EL Teachers, Title I Teachers, Paraprofessionals, and additional support staff (including those for Special Education Students and English Language Learners) will continue to provide weekly communication and support “to the extent possible” as required by law to provide the necessary supports and interventions for at risk students, subgroup populations, and on-site support students.</p>	<p>1. 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Snowflake Unified School District’s (SUSD) 2020-2021 School Year Reopening School In Person School Option

- SUSD, starting, August 17,2020 is reopening schools for regular in-person instruction while implementing the use of adopted and recommended sanitizing procedures and use of PPE, and social distancing guidelines in addition to other CDC recommended health and safety guidelines. In person instruction will be available for the same number of days per week and open the same hours offered during the prior school year before the COVID-19 closure took effect.
- Parents who are concerned about the possible exposure of Covid-19 may select to have their child/children participate in an online school option provided by SUSD. If the parent is in need of a physical location/place for their child to participate in their online schooling option, then SUSD will provide a safe, sanitized, location at each of its school sites for that on-site support option to be provided. This onsite support option will be available for the same number of days per week and open the same hours

offered during the prior school year before the COVID-19 closure took effect.

- Additionally, in the event of a school closure due to Covid-19, school locations will provide teacher led instruction via remote distance learning options until in-person learning can resume. However, the schools will each provide free on-site support options and make them available for the same number of days per week and open the same hours offered during the prior school year before the COVID-19 closure took effect.

SUSD will provide mobile ordering and curbside payment/pickup for lunches for students who are participating in the online learning option and/or distance learning, including students who qualify for free and reduced lunches. The pick-up locations will be at the High School In Snowflake and at Taylor Intermediate, so the locations are at either end of the community to more easily serve the students and families.
