

Dear Parents, Students and Staff,

I am sending this correspondence to remind everyone that the travel restrictions issued by Governor Wolf and the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH) remain in place. With the Holidays approaching, I felt it was necessary to remind all of you that the District will follow these recommendations. **Therefore, anyone who travels via air or visits any of the States on the list, will be required to quarantine for 14 days after returning to Pennsylvania, regardless of testing.**

The States that are currently on this list are as follows:

### Students

If a student has traveled to any of the identified states by the PA DOH, the student will not be permitted on campus or to participate in any school related activity for a period of 14 days from the date of return to Pennsylvania.

### Employees

If an employee voluntarily chooses to travel to any of the states listed above, the employee will **not be eligible** to receive the 10 day or 80 hour pay through the **Families First Coronavirus Response Act**. The employee would need to use vacation leave, accrued sick leave unpaid leave during the period of absence.

We have been very fortunate in keeping the District open during the first quarter of the school year. I believe this is directly related to your attentiveness in adhering to the guidelines that we put in place. We must continue to work together to make every effort to avoid unnecessary exposure that could possibly jeopardize the District staying open. Therefore, I am hoping that you take this information seriously and avoid traveling by air and/or travel to any of these states. If you have any questions related to this email, the procedures, or anything else related to COVID-19, please do not hesitate to reach out to me. If there are any updates or changes, I will get them out as timely as possible.
