ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL

Please do not drop your child off at the school before 8:30 am. Students may not enter the building in the morning before 8:30 am due to supervision reasons.

We ask for your patience during the first week or so to help us ensure we get everyone home in a safe manner. <u>Parents are asked to park in the parking lot outside of the gym. Cars are not permitted to park in the fire lane or along the curb.</u>

SCHOOL SECURITY


Since the safety of our children is one of our most important responsibilities, a security system has been implemented in our schools. Please assist us by respecting the security procedures outlined below.

- > ALL visitors must use the main entrance at the front of the building.
- > After entering through the first set of doors, press the intercom button outside the office door.
- > State your name and reason for your visit.
- > Wait for office personnel to release the door (clicking sound) before trying to open it.

Pennsylvania State Law requires <u>ALL</u> visitors to report to the main office prior to a classroom visit. Visitors will be required to wear a visitor's identification badge. The badge will be issued after registering in the office and should be returned to the office upon completion of your school business. Any items that need delivered to the classroom (i.e., books, homework, snacks, etc.) will be delivered from the office to the classroom in a timely manner. Please note that for security purposes, we will ask for ID when you pick your child up from school. Your cooperation is truly appreciated.

SNACKS

In accordance with the District's Wellness Policy, parents are asked to send in snacks that promote student health and help to reduce childhood obesity. Candy is not permitted to be sent to school as a snack or treat. Drinks are limited to water and/or 100% fruit juice. All snacks should be store bought and include the original packaging. Please check with your child's teacher before sending in a birthday snack. Refraining from sending in cookies and cupcakes is truly appreciated. Rule of thumb for snacks is 150 calories or less.

SCHOOL MEAL REMINDERS

Breakfast is FREE every day! Please encourage your children to participate.

Free and reduced meal applications were sent home on the first day of school. Please fill them out and return them to the office as quickly as possible. If you have received a notice of Direct Certification in the mail, you are already qualified for free meals for the entire school year and you do not need to fill out an application. Families only need to fill out one application for the entire family even if you have students in both schools.

The price of a student lunch is \$2.35. Students at the Elementary School will have their choice of several different meals for lunch. They may choose from the main entrée, daily alternative, chef salad, grilled chicken salad or yogurt meal. Please remember to send your child's lunch money to school in an envelope marked with their name, homeroom teacher, and student number.
