Important Dates

- The areas of Science, Social Studies, Math, and Communicative Arts will participate in a school-level interview October 7th-14th.
- World Languages, Fine Arts, and CTAE will be selected at the department level.
- **All interview dates at county and state are set and have no alternate dates**
- Fine arts county level interviews at Pebblebrook High School on Monday, November 4th
- Academic and CTAE county level interviews at Sprayberry High School on Thursday, November 7th
- Students selected as state semi-finalists notified by January 24, 2020
- State level music semifinalists will interview at Berry College on Saturday, February 22nd.
- State level non-music semifinalists will interview at Berry College on Saturday, February 29th.

Applications and Tips

- You should fill out your part of the application completely! Do a very good job and give thoughtful, detailed answers. This part REALLY matters.
- The teacher recommendation should be sent to a teacher who knows you well as a student in your major content. You might need to help them with information about awards and leadership. Make sure you give them enough time to do a good job – interviewers will make decisions about you based on what your teachers write/don't write about you.
