FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK



Dear Valued Parents,

It's been a busy week. I had new carpeting installed into the Nursery (Infant/Toddler) and Butterfly classrooms (Early Childhood) and invested in new materials for the Ladybugs (Infant / Toddler). Our Infant/Toddler Program teacher continues probation. (Note: Concerns you have expressed to me are being addressed) and we have two vacancies (1. Elementary Teacher and 2. an Infant / Toddler teacher.) *Do you know a candidate*?

This week, Liberty Montessori also began the annual relicensing process. NJ Department of Children and Families visited, and while they loved the school, we received citations for Port Liberte water temperature and because some parents have not labeled/dated food containers, clothing or completed and returned the registration packages we requested over the summer. The state also wants additional parent forms to be completed. I will send these out to you this coming week. PLEASE REMEMBER to label/ date your child's food and drinks, and sign and return the new forms.

We also began our Workshop Program. Most Butterfly parents voted to enroll in Chess and Yoga (Soccer and Music did not make the cut.) In addition, we are piloting Yoga for Toddlers (30-minute sessions on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 3:00-3:30 pm).

Finally, exploratory discussions continue as we look to expand and open Elementary I (6-9-year-old) in September 2020.
