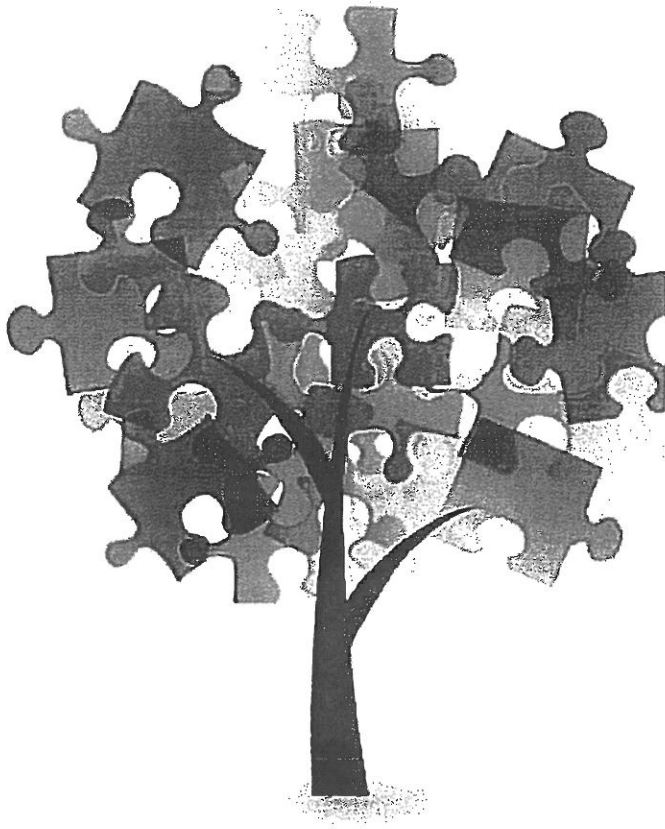

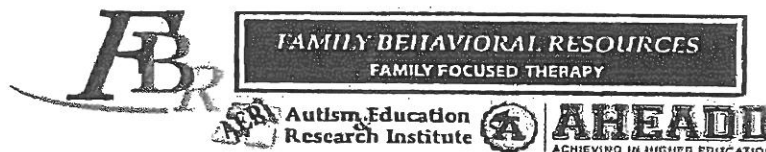

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Endeavor?

Endeavor provides an assessment based approach to aiding children and adolescents with autism to ultimately achieve the necessary skills to integrate into their natural support systems. Skills targeted include communication, socialization, and functional living skills. Endeavor will contribute to increased generalization and an overall increase in independence to assist persons with autism in becoming independent, successful members of their communities.

When is Endeavor?

Endeavor runs 2.5 hours per day, Monday through Thursday. Scheduled FALL hours are 4:00pm - 6:30pm. SUMMER hours are 1:00pm - 3:30pm. Participants are able to attend for up to 10 hours a week, but this is not a requirement. Participants are able to attend as many days/hours as prescribed within a psychological evaluation.

Who should attend Endeavor?

Endeavor is for children ages 5-21 on the Autism Spectrum. Participants must not be aggressive towards peers and should be able to be sustained at a 1:2 staffing ratio. Toilet training and fluent communication are not required to attend Endeavor, as these are skills that can be targeted through participation in the program.

Is there sufficient, reliable staff available to work with my child at Endeavor?

Endeavor is staffed at a 1:2, and all staff are trained in working with children on the autism spectrum through FBR's comprehensive training program on Autism Spectrum Disorders. In addition to the 1:2 ratio, the program is facilitated by a Licensed Program Supervisor, and there will be "floating" staff on hand in case of need.

Why should my child attend Endeavor?

Endeavor utilizes Applied Behavior Analysis as its framework for treatment. Treatment is assessment and data driven. Participants will have a functional behavior assessment and intensive skill deficit assessments completed upon admission which be used to develop an individualized treatment plan to be targeted during sessions.

Is there transportation available for the children of Endeavor?

MATP may provide transportation to and from Endeavor if needed, however, parents are encouraged to transport their children to and from Endeavor if possible.

Are meals provided at Endeavor?

Snacks/water will be available if needed, and may be used as reinforcement with consent. Caregivers are expected to provide snack/meal for scheduled snack time.

What is the parent or caregiver's role in Endeavor?

Daily progress reports and handouts will be sent home to help generalize skills introduced and targeted at Endeavor. Monthly reports of progress will also be distributed. Caregivers will be invited to participate in scheduled family sessions.

How do I enroll my child in Endeavor?

Participants in Endeavor must have a recommendation for participation in a Site Based Social Skills program through a Best Practice Evaluation. Approval must be obtained through participation in an ISPT meeting, where a referral for Endeavor can be made. Please be prepared to provide contact and insurance information for the participant and family. Upon approval, an administrator will contact you to proceed with intake procedures.
