MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL CAMPBELL

Dear Harrison Families,

I hope everyone is doing well as we look ahead to Spring Break. Our offices will be closed that week. Once we return from Spring Break, it's a quick turnaround before we begin Advanced Placement testing, End of Course Testing, and final exams. Please see the flyers below for senior finals and underclassmen finals. This information will also be posted on our school website.

Regarding End of Course Tests, remember that Georgia did not receive a waiver from the federal government to waive standardized testing. Fortunately, the State Board of Education did reduce the percentage the test counts in a student's grade to .01 so that no student will be negatively affected by the test. Our school district **will allow** the test to

count 20% if it benefits the student. The EOC's will begin the week of April 26. The test is now only administered in Algebra 1, Biology, American Literature, and United States History. Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment students in American Literature and United States History do not have to test. We anticipate our school district to release the testing plan/dates soon. We will communicate the plan as soon as we are able.

By now you have seen our school district's communication for remote learning options for the 2021/2022 school year. Families must enroll in the Cobb Online Learning Academy by April 2. The [Frequently Asked Questions Document](#) will answer many questions you may have. Students who enroll in the Cobb Online Learning Academy (COLA) will no longer be enrolled at Harrison High School thus will not be part of our extracurricular activities or receive a Harrison diploma. COLA will be following a block schedule and committing to the entire school year will be necessary to stay on track for graduation. The school district will provide additional guidance on masks and quarantine procedures at a later date. Our school day schedule next year will be five days of instruction.

Exciting news for Harrison High School ... In case you did not see *The Marietta Daily Journal* on Sunday, Harrison High School was voted for a **SECOND** year in a row as Best in Cobb High School for 2021! This is the third year that *Cobb Life Magazine* has partnered with *The Marietta Daily Journal* where readers can vote on their "favorites" in Cobb, such as restaurants, health, entertainment... and you guessed it: education! We are thankful for our dedicated students, teachers, staff, and families for making our school community so special.

For our seniors and their families, we are getting closer to commencement on Thursday, June 3 at 9:00 am at McEachern High School. We will continue to update the details for graduation in the section below as well as on the [senior section of our school website](#). One important update is as follows: Due to the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Cobb County School District was not able to finalize a commencement schedule prior to the printing deadline for graduation announcements for the Class of 2021. Therefore, the announcements were printed without a specific date. Herff Jones is printing and providing insert cards for graduates that would like to add the date and location of the ceremony with their graduation announcements. The insert cards will be made available at the school the week after Spring Break. I am also excited to pass along that we have added an additional senior event on the evening of Tuesday, May 18 as we celebrate our seniors with our second year of Hoya Lights! Details for this night of entertainment and fireworks is in the section below for senior news. We will continue to update our seniors and their families on this event as we get closer.

I hope everyone has a restful and safe Spring Break. I look forward to seeing our Hoyas safe and sound after the break on Monday, April 12 as we get ready to close out this school year.

When the student has been offered a position, the student will access [Work Permit Datasheet](#) to complete the first section (Section A) of the work permit datasheet. The student's new employer will complete Section B of the permit datasheet and provide the student with an **MSK #** that the student will submit to Harrison High School via email: harrison@cobbk12.org. The information will then be verified and the work permit issued and sent back via the email address provided. Please allow 48-72 hours for completion.
