Listed below are some ideas of things to practice during this week, if you choose to.

High Frequency Words: Gather up each week's sight words and see how quickly you can read them.

Some ideas are: Set a timer for 2 minutes and read as many words as you can. Set a timer again for 2 minutes and see if you can beat your number of words. Time how long it takes for you to read ALL of the words. Choose 8-10 sight words and make up a sentence using each word. Say your sentences orally to someone.

Reading: Choose a story book to read. This could be a book of your own, or you can go on the Epic! Website and read a story. To see if you comprehended the story take an AR Test online.

Math: Practice addition and/or subtraction math facts. If you don't have fact cards have a parent or sibling name off a fact for you to answer. (You should be able to do addition and subtraction facts to 20 to be prepared for second grade).
