

Governor's RIDE Advisory Group Seeks Input on Elevating Education in Wyoming

CHEYENNE, Wyo. – Governor Mark Gordon's K-12 Education advisory group has released a short survey seeking input and ideas from Wyoming residents on how to create the ideal education system for the future of the state. The survey will remain open until February 24, 2022.

“We want to hear from everyone who cares about Wyoming's K-12 education system – parents, students, educators and employers,” Governor Gordon said. “We want their opinions about what it is we'd like our schools to be able to deliver for our students.

[Announced in May 2021](#), the Reimagining and Innovating the Delivery of Education (RIDE) Advisory Group is tasked to study and develop recommendations for elevating Wyoming's primary and secondary education system into a position of national leadership. Its membership includes independent volunteers with an interest in Wyoming's education system. Key to that effort is learning more about what families, communities and businesses expect from the state's educational system.
