



## Tutors

Innovations is fortunate to be able to help our students by using Title I funds to contract tutors for our students during the instructional day. Many of these tutors have been with us for 2 years or more and feel very comfortable working with the teachers and the students.

Here is some information to help you understand what the tutors are doing.

1. Our tutors will be pulling small groups of students to work with each day during the Learning Lab time, assigned class times, at the end of the day during Exact Path time, and on Mondays when the students are working on the pre-assessment work for the week.

2. Tutors have been assigned groups of students to work with based on test scores from last year and the MAP scores given a week or so ago.

3. Parents may contact the school to ask for extra help for their children. When you call, make sure you give the child's name and the classroom teacher's name so we can match the tutors by grade level.

4. Tutors help our students in reading, writing, and mathematics each day. They also help students to complete missing work so their grades can be adjusted to show the work completed and submitted.

5. Mrs. Miller, our Literacy Specialist oversees the tutors. You may contact her if you have further questions or want help for your child.
