Throughout his life he took a strong interest in the young, senior citizens and those in need. He was an active volunteer and thoughtful commentator on significant issues. He composed and performed music for several community organizations and functions and was a member of a local band. This award is open to a Potter County senior graduating from a public, private, or home school in Potter County and Port Allegany High School and accepted into college or conservatory in the field of music.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Full-time resident of Potter County, graduating senior from a public, private or home-school student in Potter County and Port Allegany High School.
- Accepted into a college or conservatory in the field of music.
- Essay (200-250 words doubled spaced) on “What music means to me and how I plan to make it my career”.
- Must be a Music Major – can include Music Education or Music performance.
- Must be available to meet selection committee via Zoom and to be evaluated and score a minimum of 190 points.
- A confirmation of date, time and place will be issued to you.

Someone will contact you to set up testing which will include the following areas:

A) Performance

Student must demonstrate proficiency in any or all of the following categories: playing an instrument, singing, or in arranging/composition abilities (1-60 points)

B) Aural Skills

Ear-training skills. Ability to recognize intervals and basic chords and demonstrate the ability to write out, in music notations, upon hearing performed, basic melodies and/or chord progressions (1-30 points)

C) Theory

Knowledge of harmony: chords, notation, etc. Determined by a basic music theory test (1-60 points)

D) Dedication

Motivation and involvement with music, on their own and/or in school, and/or in community programs and events. Self-generated involvement outweighs organized programs. - (5-points for each organized ensemble & 10-points for each self-generated ensemble) *Ensembles must be verified as performing regularly. Maximum of 20 points.

E) Essay

Your written essay with the theme of “What music means to me and how I plan to make it my career.” (1-30 points)

F) Classical and Jazz Appreciation

Upon hearing recordings, students will be asked to name and/or describe stylistically (Baroque, Classical, Romantic, etc.) select pieces by prominent composers like Bach, Beethoven, Mozart, Wagner, Stravinsky, etc. (up to 15 points)

And Jazz composers such as Stan Kenton, Dave Brubeck, John Coltrane, Duke Ellington, Art Tatum, etc. (up to 15 points)

Total possible points – 260
