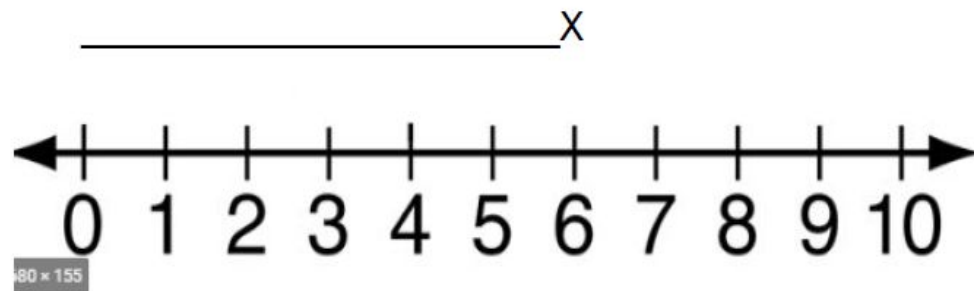

Adelita Social Studies Activity

Adelita is set in Mexico. For many Mexican celebrations, people make papel picado banners. They kind of look like placemats with cutouts hung from a string. With this activity, you can make your own papel picado banners, if you would like to.

Materials:

- Tissue paper or construction paper (rectangle shaped)
- Yarn
- Scissors
- Glue

1. Start by folding your rectangle shaped piece of paper like a fan(hot dog style.) At the bottom you will cut a scalloped, or rounded edge.
2. Fold the fanned paper in half and cut a half-diamond shape out of the scallop area.
3. Keeping the paper folded, fold it down (hamburger style)
4. Cut out patterns as if you are making a snowflake.
5. Unfold and attach to your yarn to hang up!
6. Keep making more! Don't forget to snap a picture for your teacher and have your parents post it on ClassDojo or send it in an email.

- 3 People crossed the seas to live in the New World. Our fruit trees came from other lands, too. Apples, pears, and cherries came from Europe and Asia. Peaches came from China.
- 4 Fruits are much better now than they were long ago. They are bigger. They taste better. This is because people learned how to grow better fruit. Some even learned to grow new kinds of fruit. One new fruit was part plum and part apricot. It was called a plumcot.
