7am-7:30am: My day started with a much needed shower, I woke up my four children ages 19, 17, 13, and 11 and got them started with their chores and reminders of assignments.

7:30am-8:00am: Visit with my husband who is a night shift nurse and get ready for the day.

8:00am-8:25am: Say good night to my husband and clean the kitchen

8:30-9am- Set up for passing out packets

9am-11:00: I get to go down and pass out packets at the school. We have become quit the operation. One person asks grade, teacher's name, and child's name. Two people check off the names (one takes pre $k-1^{st}$ and the other $2^{nd}-5^{th}$) another person gathers the packet and hands it to the car. We have a sped IA listening for any of our sped classes to offer them special packets as well.

Also, in addition to the packets we pass out a special treat to each of the kids who come. Last week was a book, today was extra snacks from the classrooms which were packed up by our office staff the previous day.

11am-11:30: clean up, collect and count/ highlight the names of kids who came.

11:30-12:00: Call home to make sure my kids walk down to the bus to get their lunch and make extra packets, get tubs ready to pass out again at 5pm

12:00pm-1:00pm: Google meets IA meeting with Mrs. Osorio and Mrs. Davis

1:00pm-2pm: Intervention meeting with Stevenson to go over my sipps lessons that I am making for my intervention kids.

2:00-4:30pm- go over with my kids what they have done and turned in. Hand my kids their new packets and visit and have fun with my family.

4:30-6:15pm- I am right back at the school handing about packets.

This is what a normal Tuesday looks like for me. It has been so rewarding to be able to serve the kids in this way. The kids love seeing us, even though we are wearing funny masks and gloves. They are full of smiles. The parents are full of thanks and praises.
