I hope everyone had a wonderful fall break and is excited to be back at school. The teachers have a busy nine weeks planned for the students and didn't miss a beat getting started up again.

Starting this quarter, we will be holding after school tutoring. Students were recommended by teachers and permission slips and tutoring agreements were sent home before break. Tutoring will start this week and run through the week of December 12. In addition, we have a couple different after-school activities opened to our FBP Mustangs. Community Education is offering soccer & basketball; Coach Webster is offering an Intramural Fitness Training for 4th & 5th Grades; and Mrs. Edwards is offering choir and hand bells for our 2nd-5th graders. We are learning the letters y, and x. Then, qu, and z. Then, we will be finishing off Unit 1 and moving into Unit 2 the following week before Thanksgiving break. Unit 2 covers all capital letters within 4 weeks. We will still be skywriting, letter finding (magnetic boards), writing them in our notebooks & on dry erase boards and reviewing the letter-keyword-sound and getting into blending c-v-c words (tapping).

Along with identifying the letters, on Thursdays, we discuss sentence structure —capital letter at the beginning of the sentence, changing words to build a complete sentence and always ending with a period or question mark. Fridays, Momma Echo tells stories which leads us into sequencing beginning, middle and end and discussing with pictures, parts of the reading. Not only does Momma Echo tell stories, Fundations has given us other books to read that reflects other areas of phoneme segmentation — Rhyming and syllable practice. -We also align our stories with thinking maps and write about it.


Terrific 3rd Graders Ms. Campbell, Mrs. Hudson, Mrs. Sanchez & Mrs. Skon

Nurse's Updates- Dana Sandlin

Flu shots are now available in Arizona. Check with your health care provider about getting your child a flu shot this year. It is especially important to get the shot early before the flu season starts because it takes about two weeks for it to be effective. Flu season usually starts in October and peaks in January and February.

Cold and flu season usually start in the fall. Please keep your child home for a fever of 100 or higher, chest congestion and frequent coughing with or without a fever, sore throat, rash, or vomiting and diarrhea. A child should be fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication before returning to school. Also they should not have vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school

I will be continuing hearing and vision screening for all K-2 grade student's and new students. If your child doesn't pass a second screening you will be sent a referral. Please let me know the outcome of the referral and return the paper completed by the medical provider.

We need gently used clothes for both boys and girls in sizes 5 to 12. Any donations are appreciated. If your child has borrowed any clothes for the health office please return them.
