5th graders completed the science MCA test this week, so all state-wide assessments have been completed for the year. Please thank your child for all of the hard work!

Next week, we will be testing K-5 with the final MAPS test, our chosen local assessment (a standardized test is mandatory for all schools). Please be sure that your child gets extra sleep the night before testing and a good breakfast the morning of, and also see that students get to school on time. Remind students to do their best work and to take their time. Thank you!

We have COVID-19 saliva test kits available for all families. Please let me know if you would like one and we can send home in backpacks. Any family may take advantage of this, Saplings or K-5.

Please note that the school calendar says that the last day of school is Friday, May 28. **We will have school on-site this day, so it is NOT a distance learning day.** There is also an early release at 12:00. Considering this, the last Friday distance learning day is: May 21.

This week has flown by in a blur, the children were busy, busy, busy! We began the week by finishing up last week's weather theme with rainbows. We tried a new experiment called "a walking rainbow." We used 6 small mason jars, 6 rolled paper towels, water and food coloring. The water very quickly moved from jar to jar, ending up with an equal amount of water in each jar and the mixed colors of a rainbow. It was pretty cool. Tuesday began our Earth Day theme. The children learned what earth looks like from space, a variety of ways that we can care for the earth, and what can be recycled. We also got out a display of magnets for the children to explore.

The academic focus was syllables. We began by clapping the syllables of their names, then moved on to words. The big kids returned to color word recognition and took on the challenge of combining syllables and color words. These children that are moving on to kindergarten next year are raring to go! They like to work hard and are confident in their ability to do hard things. I love it!

The kindergarteners are practicing reading, writing, and letters. We are working on including spacing, punctuation, and correct spelling in our writing.

In math, the first graders and kindergarteners learned about money. We learned about the penny, nickel, and dime. We practiced counting them all together. We played a few whole group money games. The older kids got to pair up with the younger kids and practice their leadership and helper skills! We are also reviewing a few key concepts in preparation for the NWEA testing next week.

4th & 5th Grade Elementary Teacher

Congratulations to 4th and 5th graders for finishing their MCA standardized testing. Students worked hard and took the test very seriously. Next week, we will finish all of our testing for the year with our MAPS testing. Keep up the great work, 4/5!

This week, 4/5th grade has enjoyed learning about different internal systems in the body this week. We learned about the circulatory, respiratory and digestive systems in humans and in animals. We supplemented our book studies with information from BrainPop and played a board game that taught us how blood moves different things such as oxygen, carbon dioxide, sugar and protein, and waste throughout the body.

We have also been working on new stories in reading. 4th grade read about a double dutch jump rope team from Long Island, focusing on the sequence of how the team was created. We watched a few videos of jump roping competitions and were completely awed by what these teams are able to do! In 5th grade, we read about the Myers family, a father and son who are authors and illustrators of children's books. We also spent some time working on our informational essays, working on adding appropriate introductions and conclusions to our work.

In math, fourth and fifth grade has been working on reviewing a variety of topics, including finding common denominators with fractions and dividing fractions. Students have been doing excellent work reviewing and expanding their knowledge of fractions.

Parents and loved ones, please be sure to check the weather forecast and send your student(s) with appropriate gear for the day. Some spring days are quite warm, while others make us feel winter has returned. Please make sure students have layers to wear outside to keep warm on the playground.
